State Identified Measurable Result (SiMR):

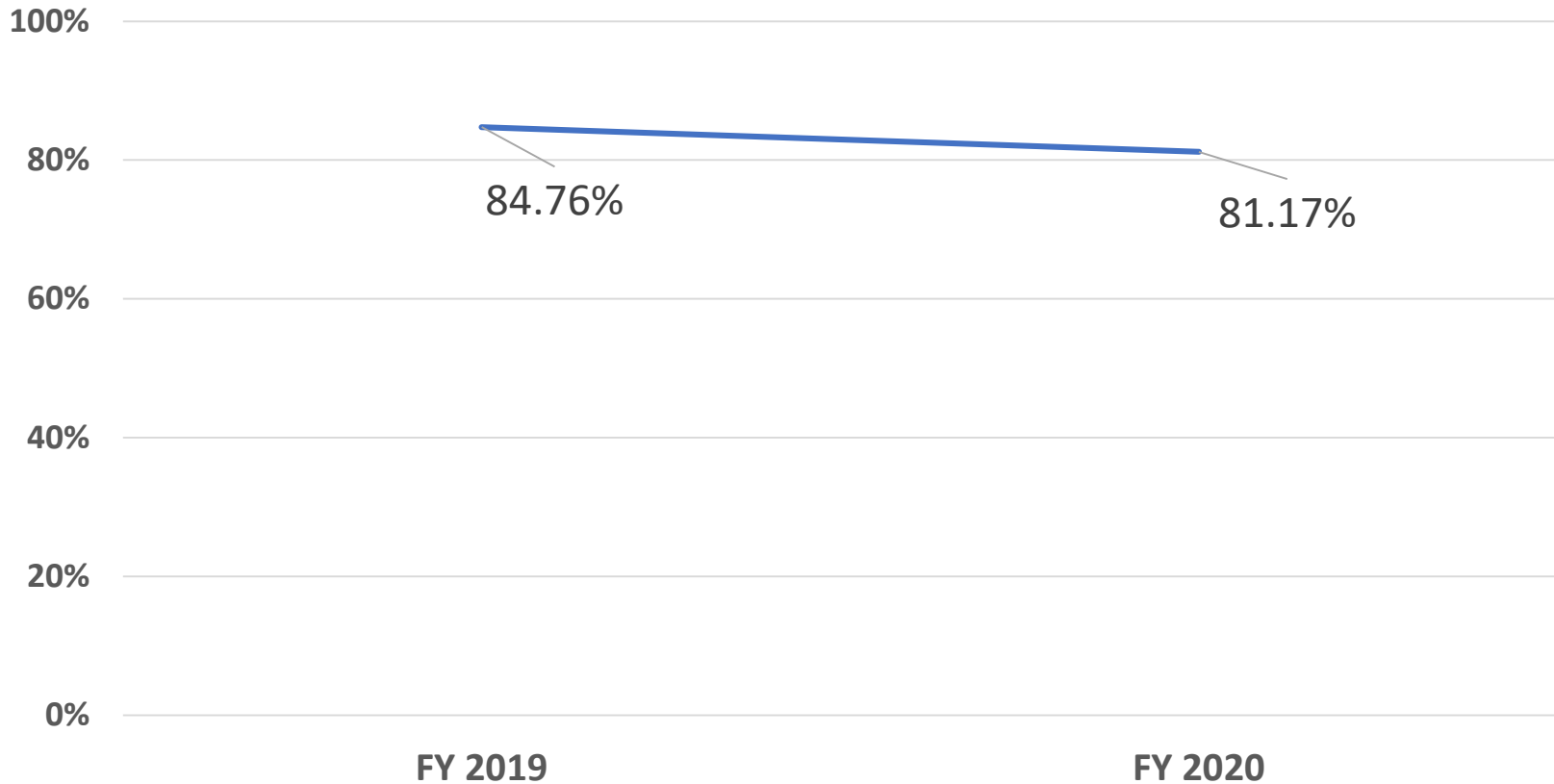
Pennsylvania's families and caregivers of infants, toddlers, and preschoolers with IFSP/IEPs will increase their competence and confidence to help their children learn across settings.
