









Practice Documents and Core Elements from Professional Organizations

Core elements of coordination and collaboration, family-centered practice, and databased intervention/instruction are common to all personnel serving infants and young children with disabilities, aged birth through 5 years, and their families. The following resources from professional organizations support those foundational elements of service delivery as outlined in OCDEL Announcement El - 20 - 03: Early Intervention Service Delivery: Coaching Across Settings.

The American Occupational Therapy Association

The Role of Occupational Therapy in Early Intervention discusses the concepts of collaboration, beamwork, and family-centered care. This document indicates that although Early intervention services and supports are typically provided to children under the age of 3 years and their families, these services may extend to children through 5 years of age.






Fidelity is not something to be reached, but rather something that we measure.

Fidelity of Implementation

Fidelity refers to measuring the degree to which staff are able to use practices as intended.

~ National Implementation Research Network

Fidelity Threshold Score

- important for understanding whether providers are implementing practices sufficiently to achieve intended child and family outcomes.
- predetermined level on a fidelity tool that distinguishes between practitioners not demonstrating and those demonstrating adequate practice implementation.
- identifies practitioners who may need more support and practice to reach fidelity and those whose support could be reduced.


In Pennsylvania Early Intervention Infant Toddler programs, fidelity of implementation is measured using the Family Guided Routines Based Intervention (FGRBI) Key Indicator Checklist.

The Manual needs to be used in conjunction with the Key Indicator Checklist













75% or higher is the fidelity threshold score in order for Early Intervention Infant Toddler Special Instructors and Therapists to receive a certificate of endorsement from OCDEL as an **Early Intervention Coach**.



We strive for fidelity of implementation in Early Intervention to assure children and families across our programs receive consistent services from all providers and that the services delivered are based on scientific research and recommended practices.

- has the knowledge and skills essential to engage families and apply FGRBI principles and practices in their home visits











































Key Messages

What are Some Current Training Paths?

Professional Learning Communities PLCs

• Purpose:

 Provide content knowledge and basic application practices of FGRBI & **Caregiver Coaching for community** providers

Sequence:

- Pre & Post Home Visit assessment Online modules and webinars prior to group sessions
- 6 months of small group PLC applying **Coaching Practices**

Trio Sessions

• Purpose:

- Provide context for Trainee Coach development of knowledge and skills
- Provide knowledge and practice of FGRBI & Caregiver Coaching to fidelity for champions, potential coaches, providers interested in immersive PD

• Sequence:

 Torsh Portal Steps 1-3 (self directed, online including modules) Trio coaching for minimum of 2 videos may be extended if not at fidelity









PLC Session:

Learn About It

Prior to the Session:

 Participants collect and submit short clips demonstrating implementation of 2-3 indicators and receive written feedback including celebration of observed strengths and coaching to increase capacity from reliable coder

During the Session:

- First 45 minutes welcome, check in, participant Key Indicator video clip review and discussion
- Remaining hour and 15 minutes new content review supported by video examples; application activities; challenge question review; instructions for video recording and due dates for clips shared
- Between sessions providers practice Key Indicators, record and share clips of their practice

Session Length – 2 hours in person via zoom









Trio Session:

Learn About It

Prior to session:

- One trio member records a full session, uploads it to TORSH and completes a self assessment.
- Provider Coach or Trainee and Master Coaches code the video for fidelity, add comments to support the trio's understanding, and shares the video with additional trio members to watch.

During the session:

- Session is reviewed following a predictable agenda.
- Coding and strengths are reviewed for each component of the SSOOPPRR cycle.
- Trio members are engaged in reflection and discussion
- Video owner is supported to set coaching goals

Session length: 1 hour in person via zoom, 1 hour prep

What does it take to provide these opportunities at a county or agency level?

Professional Learning Communities (PLCs)

- Training of trainers (knowledge and understanding of FGRBI framework)
- Trainers must be able to provide feedback for skill improvement
- Reliable video coders

Trio Sessions

- Trainee Coach and Master Coach (MC) or a Provider Coach(PC)
- PCs and MCs demonstrate knowledge and understanding of FGRBI framework and can provide feedback for skill improvement
- PCs and MCs are reliable video coders



The Coach Training Sequence

The following competency-based professional development sequence is designed to

- ensure that coaches have the knowledge and skills to coach peers implementing FGRBI to achieve and maintain fidelity
- offer professional development to other team members on the approach within their county or agency











TRAINEE COACH



- meets and maintains fidelity in working with families as an Early Intervention Coach
- has the skills and interest to be a Provider Coach
- is working with a Master Coach to develop competence to coach providers to reach fidelity as Early Intervention Coaches working with families











PROVIDER COACH



- meets and maintains fidelity as both an Early Intervention Coach and Provider Coach
- is able to support providers to reach and maintain fidelity as Early Intervention Coaches working with families











MASTER COACH



- meets and maintains fidelity as both an Early Intervention Coach and Provider Coach
- is able to identify and coach Trainee Coaches
- has a role in supporting Provider Coaches
- has a role in reporting and monitoring fidelity of Early Intervention Coaches and Provider Coaches













Key Messages

- Many of the trainings done in the past have prepared us to move forward
- We aren't starting over; we're building upon the skills and knowledge that we already have
- New trainings available allow us to move forward with Coaching as a state in a way that is evidence based and consistent across counties and programs.
